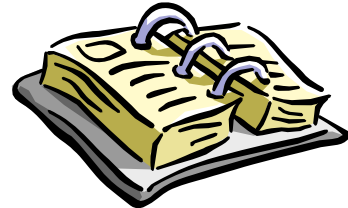

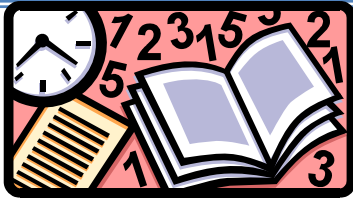
**Time is running out for all

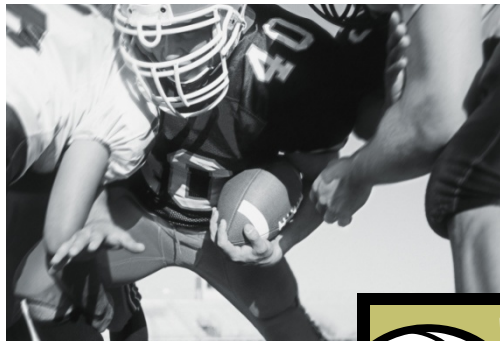

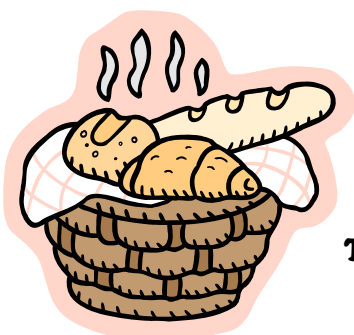
