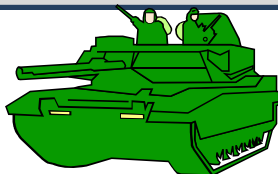


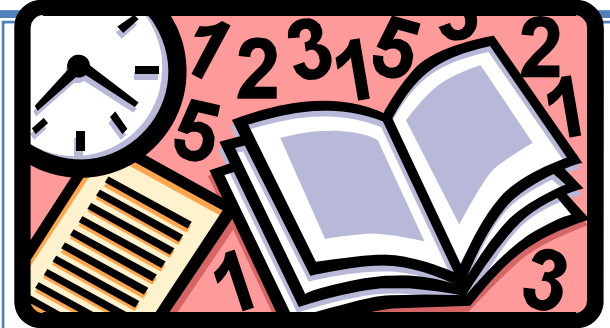

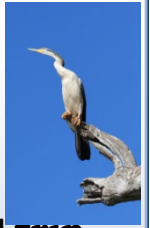

Please buy your tickets for the Variety Show on Saturday, October 24, 2009, @ 6:00 P.M. This will be an enjoyable evening for all who attend.

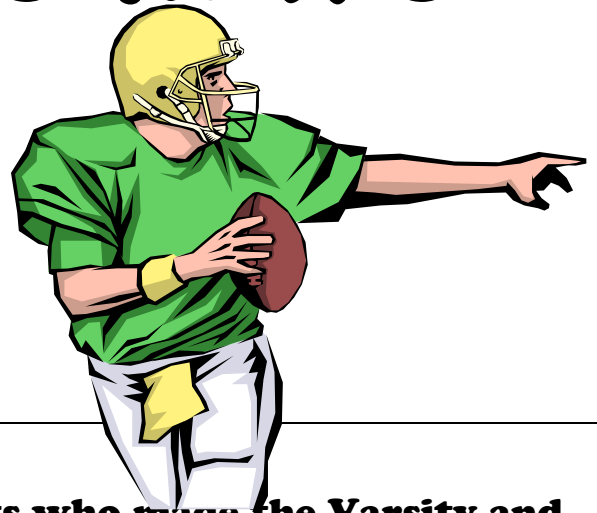
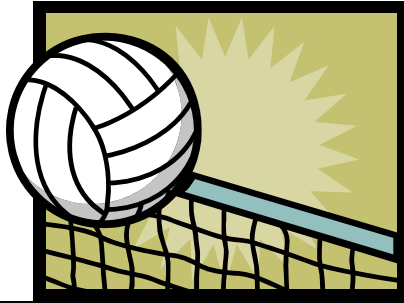
The PTF will meet next Thursday, October 22nd, @ 6:00 P.M. in the sanctuary. Our band students will be performing. The topics of discussion will be:

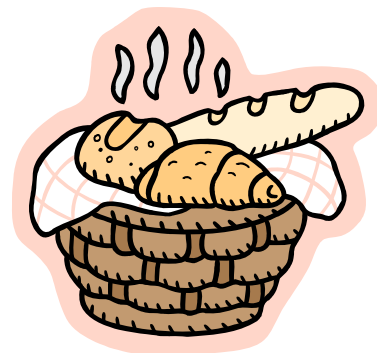

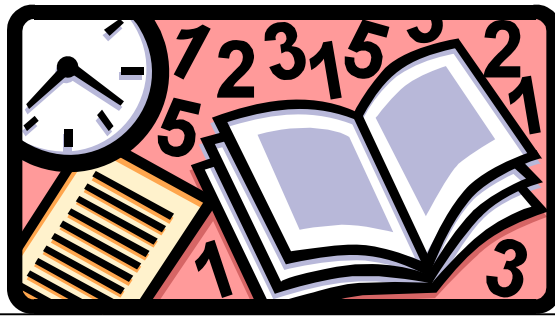
